



BILLINGHAM TOWN AFC LTD COVID 19 SPECTATOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Introduction

Since the outbreak of Corona Virus (CV19) it has had a major impact upon Football throughout the country and in particular on grassroots football. As a Club we have a duty of care to our players, support staff and our supporters and visitors to the Club. We have developed a comprehensive risk assessment taking account of Health and Safety and Government and Football Association advice and guidelines, along with Action Plans to take account of the specific issues relating to the Football Activity and the leisure side in the Clubhouse.

It was also essential under the current climate to develop a code of conduct for spectators and supporters visiting the Club.

For this reason we have implemented this code of conduct, which includes a basic commitment not only to respect the social distancing needs of others, but also to avoid doing things that, may risk the health of other supporters, players and support staff at the ground.

The Club and supporters share the responsibility to act with care and consideration, in the interests of everyone including our own community as a whole.

AT ALL TIMES OBSERVE SOCIAL DISTANCING AND AVOID CLOSE CONTACT WITH OTHERS WHO ARE NOT IN YOUR SOCIAL BUBBLE

- Arrive in good time to avoid queues where possible. [L] [SEP]
- For spectators in standing areas, adhere to requests to spread out or move to other areas. [L] [SEP]
- Be aware that your temperature might be taken before entry. [L] [SEP]
- Be aware you might be required to wear a mask or face covering. [L] [SEP]
- If you are seated, when moving past other spectators, to and from your seat, please avoid face to face contact with other spectators
- If you are standing, please stay in your allocated space, within your social bubble, and be aware of the movements of others at all times [L] [SEP]
- Maintain good hand hygiene – use the sanitiser dispensers provided and avoid touching your face, or handles, railings whenever possible [L] [SEP]
- Always cover your mouth if needing to cough or sneeze [L] [SEP]
- Avoid hugs, high-fives and any close contact with people who are not within your social bubble
- No shouting, singing or chanting. Attempt to keep celebrations to a minimum
- If you are attending with other members of your social bubble, please make sure they all have [L] [SEP] read and understood this code of conduct [L] [SEP]
- No more than 6 people in a group
- You will be required to give contact details to assist in NHS track and trace.
